

OUR STUDENTS ARE BEING DEEPLY UNDERFUNDED:

Because of the way New Jersey's school funding laws are set up, public charter schools receive zero dollars in facilities funding from the state. This means they are forced to spend dollars on facilities that could be used in our classrooms - more than \$47 million in 2017 alone.

This means our children are being funded like second-class students. They're being funded at just 73 cents on the dollar compared to other public school students.

HOW DO WE FIX IT?

The state of New Jersey is about to embark on a comprehensive review of charter school laws.

We need to mobilize, to make sure Commissioner of Education Lamont Repollet knows that we won't stand for our students being treated unfairly, and demand fair funding now.
